## THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY 2025–2026

Poly Prep is an academically rigorous co-educational country day school of 1,156 students. The school's 25-acre campus in the Dyker Heights section of Brooklyn, in operation since 1917, includes students in grades five through twelve with a current enrollment of 894. Our Lower School in Park Slope has 262 children enrolled from nursery to fourth grade. The school's population reflects the great urban diversity of Brooklyn and New York City. Approximately 55% of our students are children of color. Central to our educational mission is to prepare students to work and cooperate successfully in a pluralistic community. The size of the graduating class of 2026 will be 138. Poly Prep does not provide class rank. Typically, 100% of Poly Prep graduates attend four-year colleges.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to enroll in at least six courses every term through to graduation. Each student must fulfill the following requirements:

- 4 years of English
- 4 years of Mathematics
- 3 years of History
- 3 years of Science
- 3 consecutive years of the same Classical or World Language (with Level III completion)
- 5 semesters of Arts, including a visual art, music, and public-speaking course (Note: Certain students elect to specialize in a Performing Arts Pathway or a Visual Arts Pathway to complete this requirement)
- 2 semesters of Computer Science/Technology
- 1 semester of Health
- 1 semester of Philosophy (Grade 12)
- Senior Plan (Capstone research course for all Grade 12 students)
- Successful completion of Physical Education

## WITHDRAWAL POLICY

As of this year, our system automatically enters a "W" in all reports for any course from which a student withdrew during the academic year. Withdrawals for Grade 12 students will be represented on all documents sent to colleges, including first quarter progress reports, first semester report cards, and end-of-year transcripts. Any necessary context will be provided in additional notes to the report or transcript.

## ADVANCED STUDY

**Advanced courses are offered in all departments.** They are denoted on transcripts as either “Advanced” or “Adv.”

**As of the 2022–23 academic year, Poly stopped offering A.P. courses.** Our advanced curriculum does not adhere to College Board A.P. curriculum or culminate in A.P. exams.

Students are leveled in their first two years of Upper School and may be enrolled by the school in advanced courses in languages, math, and science. In Grades 11 and 12 their advanced course load is a product of their individual passions, ambition, and aptitude, and decided in consultation among each student, their academic advisors, and faculty.

**Therefore, the number of Upper Advanced Courses (those taken in Grades 11 and 12) is the best indicator of rigor in a student’s academic path.**

## OTHER ADVANCED WORK

**Certain advanced courses are limited as follows:**

- Advanced Calculus II, Linear Algebra, and Advanced Physics Mechanics classes are only available to Grade 12 students except in highly unusual circumstances.
- Mandarin is offered as an advanced course only in the endpoint year.

**Visual and Performing Arts:** Students may be designated as advanced in performance ensembles. Concert Choir, Concert Band, and Dance all have advanced levels. Jazz Band is also considered advanced, as it is audition-based and requires a high level of musicianship. Studio Art classes also have advanced levels: semester classes such as Drawing Practices II and Advanced Digital Photography require department approval, as does the full year Advanced Drawing and Painting Portfolio class.

**Accelerated Math:** In addition to advanced math classes, accelerated level classes are offered starting in Grade 10 to students performing exceptionally well in our general curriculum.

**Science Research:** Science Research is a multi-year commitment beginning in Grade 10 or 11 involving independent research projects mentored by internal and outside faculty and culminating in presentations and science fair competition. Science Research is undertaken in addition to core science courses, not in place of them, and occupies an additional place in both semesters of a student’s schedule.

**Independent Studies:** Students can propose to work individually with a faculty member to pursue a subject not in the curriculum and/or not able to fit in their daily schedule.

**Excellence in the Arts:** Students with exceptional levels of course rigor, participation, leadership, service, and accomplishment in the arts will graduate with a certificate of excellence in the arts, which is indicated on their final transcript.

**Global Studies:** In Grades 10–11, students with interest in exploring sustainability across the curriculum create a portfolio focused on one of three areas drawn from the U.N.’s Sustainable Development Goals: Social, Institutional, or Environmental. This work culminates in a capstone presentation; the students also graduate with this distinction (Global Studies Scholar) indicated on their final transcript. Our highest-level language learners in this group compete for a grant to study abroad and complete their capstone in the target language for further distinction (Global Studies Language Scholar).

## REPORTING OF DISCIPLINE IN THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

Students are expected to be honest in their communications to colleges and universities. Poly Prep and/or the student reports suspensions and expulsions that occur while a student is enrolled in grades nine through twelve to colleges and universities to which the student applies. When a suspension or expulsion occurs after college applications have been submitted, Poly Prep and/or the student informs colleges and universities about the change in the student’s status.
