## THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY 2018–2019

Poly Prep is an academically rigorous co-educational country day school of 1,119 students. The school's 25-acre campus in the Dyker Heights section of Brooklyn, in operation since 1917, includes students in grades five through twelve with a current enrollment of 878. Our Lower School in Park Slope has 248 children enrolled from nursery to fourth grade. The school's population reflects the great urban diversity of Brooklyn and New York City. Approximately 39% of our students are children of color. Central to our educational mission is to prepare students to work and cooperate successfully in a pluralistic community. The size of the graduating class of 2020 will be 125. Poly Prep does not provide class rank. Typically, 100% of Poly Prep graduates attend four-year colleges.

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Poly Prep offers 19 College Board Advanced Placement courses to selective students. Well-qualified math and science students begin A.P. preparation as early as Grade 9. In accordance with school policy, students enrolled in A.P. courses are required to sit for the national exam. Five-year average results of overall outcomes are below.
